Prof. Dr Tünde A. Barabás

Andrea Tünde Barabás: lawyer, criminologist, professor. She is head of department at the National Institute of Criminology. Since 2012 she is Chair of Department of Criminology at the National University of Public Service. She graduated in 1988 from Eötvös Loránd University's Faculty of Law. In 1989, she won a scientific scholarship from the Hungarian Academy of Sciences and started working at the Chair of Criminology of Eötvös Loránd University. In 1990, she pursued a year for postgraduate studies at the Criminal Law Department of the University of Fribourg with supporting of the Swiss Confederation Fellowship. She wrote her PhD thesis on the restriction of imprisonment and its alternatives. In 2008, she won the Hungarian Academy of Sciences's Bolyai János research fellowship to study the possibilities of extending the application of mediation and of regulating mediation in prison.

She is a founding member and the vice-chair of the Restorative Justice section and chair of Victimology Section the of the Hungarian Society of Criminology.

She has participated in a number of international research projects funded by the European Union, such as *The Identification and Prevention of Opportunities that Facilitate Organised Crime* supported by the Falcone Programme; the *Crime Prevention Carousel (CPC)* research within the framework of the AGIS program; the COST A/21 programme of the EU on *Restorative Justice Developments in Europe*; and the *Insecurities in European Cities (INSEC)* FP5 project; the *Mediation and Restorative Justice in Prison Settings (MEREPS)* project funded by the EU's Criminal Justice programme; and the *Tackle Insecurity in Marginalized Areas (MARGIN)* project, funded by the HORIZON 2020 program.

She has written over 149 articles and studies, edited/co-edited 14 books and is the author of two monographs.

Dr Éva Inzelt PhD

She is an Assistant Professor at Eötvös Loránd University, Faculty of Law. She has a PhD. in Law. The title of her thesis is *Corruption – with or without a white collar. The changing meaning and forms of the white collar crime*. She has done several empirical researches. Between 2012–2014, with the support of the National Scientific Research Fund Program (OTKA K106011.2012.) she carried out a study dealt with Corruption from the viewpoint of the Criminal Justice System.

Between 2016 and 2017, she participated a project which financed by the Ministry of the Interior from the Internal Security Fund. The study focused on the investigation of transnational organized crime. She dealt with the question of investigative experiences of economic crimes and corruption. Between 2018 and 2021, she was the leader of a research entitled *Theoretical and empirical approaches towards a better understanding of corporate crime in Hungary*, which was supported by the National Research, Development and Innovation Office (FK124968). One of the main goal of that study was to exploration and elucidation of the complex interrelationships related to the phenomena of corporate crime and the operation of the Hungarian market economy.

In this project she acts as a project coordinator. She carries out the professional coordination of the project. She runs and coordinates the foreign team members work, prepares professional materials (questionnaire, articles, summaries), and contributes to the performance of the tasks undertaken in the project through her research activities.

Krisztina Farkas was a lecturer at the Pázmány Péter Catholic University, she taught a special course in the field of criminal procedure law and some other courses on the postgraduate training titled Combating Cybercrime, Corruption and Money Laundering.
